1.0 Scope

This policy applies to consumers and transporters of potable water supplied by Mackay Regional Council, both within its water supply districts and in areas to which it supplies potable water outside of these districts.

The main objective of this policy is to provide guidelines to effectively manage the conservation of water.

2.0 Purpose

The intent of this policy is to:

1. Provide guidelines for the conservation of potable water for stated purposes by:
 - (a) specifying the hours when water may or may not be used; or
 - (b) specifying the way water may be used and the method for dispersing water.
2. Provide guidelines in respect to the conditions which water restrictions may be introduced.
3. Provide exemptions for imposed water restrictions.

3.0 Reference

- *Water Supply (Safety and Reliability) Act 2008*
 - Section 41(1) provides the head of power for implementation of water restrictions under this policy.
 - Section 41(2) provides the conditions for restriction of water including climatic conditions, water conservation needs, demand management etc.
 - Section 43(5) sets the maximum penalty for contravention of a water restriction.
- The *State Penalties Enforcement Act 1999* provides the head of power for an infringement notice offence that is issued under the *Water Supply (Safety and Reliability) Act 2008*, section 43(5).
- The policy and associated documents including Water Conservation Measures Application for Exemption or Amendment Form are managed by Mackay Regional Council Water & Waste Services, a Business Unit of Mackay Regional Council.

- The policy and associated documentation is subject to review and internal audit to ensure requirements of legislation, internal and external customers and Mackay Regional Council, are met and remain current.

4.0 Definitions

To assist in interpretation the following definitions shall apply:

Active playing surface shall mean a grass or synthetic area for playing sports such as a tennis court, turf cricket pitch, running track, hockey pitch, bowling green, croquet green, golf green or tee, football, soccer, volleyball, netball or basketball field and any similar area.

Alternate days shall mean designated days of water use, such that where permitted in Schedule 1:

- Properties with an odd street number may water on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday;
- Properties with an even street number may water on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday;
- Properties without a Council prescribed street number may water on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday.

Authorised Officer shall mean a person authorised by Mackay Regional Council to exercise the powers of an authorised person under the Water Act and State Penalties Enforcement Act.

Commercial market garden or plant nursery shall mean land used primarily for the growing of plants including produce and turf for sale or distribution for profit.

Council shall mean the Mayor and Councillors of Mackay Regional Council.

Domestic purposes shall mean potable water taken from the water supply system inside any premise for drinking, cooking, washing persons and clothes, use for dishwashing, or cleaning, heating and cooling a building.

Drip system shall mean a watering system that restricts the flow of water to a nominal amount such as an emitter and applies water directly to the soil around plants and should incorporate a manual or automatic timer in operational condition.

Exemption shall mean permission approved by Mackay Regional Council in writing and accepted by an applicant that modifies or waives any water conservation measure under this policy.

Exemption permit shall mean a permit issued by Mackay Regional Council granting an exemption from water conservation measures to an approved exemption holder. An exemption permit must be displayed in a prominent position on the property and will contain the name of the exemption holder, an approved property address, an approval number, any conditions attached to the approval and a commencement and expiry date or a Level to which the approval is given.

Water efficient sprinkler shall mean a sprinkler supplied by a fixed pipe or hose.

Hand-held trigger or twist nozzle shall mean a hose or pipe connected to a trigger or twist nozzle device to convey water, held in the physical possession of a person or under the supervision of a person aged 16 years or over, controlling the efficient distribution of water.

MRC shall mean Mackay Regional Council.

Microspray shall mean a watering system that creates a fine jet or mist of water and should incorporate a manual or automatic timer in operational condition.

Non-active playing surface shall mean the area of any sports ground that is not an active playing surface as defined.

Paved area shall mean footpath, driveway, hard standing area or similar having an impervious surface such as concrete, asphalt, paving stones, tiles, etc.

Portable wading pool shall mean any demountable, temporary and transportable pool having a capacity less than or equal to 500 litres.

Private pool and spa shall mean any pool, spa or ornamental pond which is not a Mackay Regional Council owned public asset.

Public pool shall mean pools open to the public or individuals operated by Mackay Regional Council.

Public spa shall mean spas open to the public or individuals operated by Mackay Regional Council.

Private garden shall mean land, garden, lawn or grassed area used in relation to residential purposes, industrial, commercial or farming activities, hospitals and aged care facilities, schools, college, university and research facilities, cemetery or crematorium including any like area adjacent to a private garden, excluding sports ground contained within such.

Public parks and gardens shall mean land, garden, lawn or grassed area controlled by Mackay Regional Council or other statutory public authority including a nature strip, road verge, median strip, roundabouts, botanic gardens and footpaths.

Sports ground shall mean land used for the purpose of any sport, game or other form of recreation.

Sprinkler shall mean a pipe or hose system and nozzle, soaker-hose or similar device used to distribute, sprinkle or spray water in any manner other than by a hand-held hose excluding microspray and drip systems, misting systems used in the commercial propagation of seeds or fogging systems used in commercial poultry industry.

Level shall mean the increment as set out in Schedule 1 of this policy designating particular water conservation criteria.

Timer shall mean any electronic or mechanical timing device that is used to regulate the time and duration of water flow to a sprinkler, microspray or drip watering system.

Trigger nozzle or twist nozzle shall mean a control nozzle intended to be used by persons that stop the flow of water by means of a lever or similar device that positively shuts off the supply of water when released.

Water shall mean potable water supplied from Mackay Regional Council's water supply system.

Water supply system shall mean Mackay Regional Council's infrastructure assets associated with the provision and distribution of water to customers, consumers, users and transporters of water.

Water toys / facilities shall mean any entertainment toy, facility or structure, which is operated by or uses non-recirculating running water from a hose or pipe as part of its use.

5.0 Background

Mackay Regional Council is responsible for providing a reliable water supply to its customers. Water restrictions are necessary to ensure that the region's consumption does not outweigh supply, and that the water infrastructure can cope with the level of demand. Without effectively monitoring and managing water, the region could face serious water supply issues, which would have an adverse impact on the region.

6.0 Policy Statement

Mackay Regional Council Water & Waste Services ensures planned management of water restrictions through the following actions and checks.

6.1 Application Process

This policy applies to consumers and transporters of potable water supplied by MRC, both within its water supply districts and in areas to which it supplies potable water outside of those districts.

Water restrictions may be applied separately or for any or all of the below or for part of any water supply scheme areas:

- Mackay Water Supply Scheme including Alexandra, Andergrove, Bakers Creek, Ball Bay, Beaconsfield, Blacks Beach, Bucasia, Cape Hillsborough, Chelona, Cremorne, Dolphin Heads, East Mackay, Eimeo, Erakala, Farleigh, Glenella, Greenmount, Habana, Hailiday Bay, Hampden, Kuttabul, Mackay, Mackay Harbour, McEwens Beach, Mount Jukes, Mount Pleasant, North Mackay, Oakenden, Ooralea, Paget, Palmyra, Pleystowe, Racecourse, Richmond, Rosella, Rural View, Seaforth, Shoal Point, Slade Point, South Mackay, Te Kowai, The Leap, Walkerston and West Mackay.
- Eton
- Calen / Kolijo
- Bloomsbury
- Supply connected to the Midge Point Transfer Main Reticulation Network including Midge Point / Laguna Whitsunday Resort
- Sarina areas including Louisa Creek, Hay Point, Koumala, Armstrong Beach, Freshwater Pt, Sarina Beach, Campwin Beach, Grasstree Beach, Salonika Beach and Half Tide
- Mirani and Marian
- Gargett, Finch Hatton and Pinnacle

Filling and topping up of water storage tanks in areas incorporating water supply by 'tank replenishment schemes' is exempt from the requirements

under “Dams and Tanks” of Schedule 1, however persons must comply with all other water restrictions measures in place.

Nothing in this policy prevents the use of:

- a. Water drawn from a source other than from the water supply system under the control of MRC; or
- b. Reclaimed or used water; or
- c. Private bores; or
- d. Rainwater collected in tanks (unless the tank is topped up by the MRC water supply) or dams; or
- e. Water supplied from another service provider.

To assist investigation of alleged contravention of water restrictions, MRC encourages persons accessing private bores to register their details.

6.4 Declaration of Water Restrictions

Subject to the provisions of the *Water Supply (Safety and Reliability) Act 2008*, if MRC considers it necessary to reduce the consumption of water taken from its water supply system, declaration of water restrictions will be made at one of the below levels:

- Level 1 Mild restrictions
- Level 2 Medium restrictions
- Level 3 High restrictions
- Level 4 Critical restrictions

Schedule 1 provides permitted and prohibited use or time of use for each level.

As required, the CEO may approve the level of water restriction that applied to an area if necessary, either higher or lower in severity, and upon such declaration, such new level will revoke any previous declaration.

6.5 Publication of Water Restrictions

Declaration and revocation of water restrictions will be by public notice and other means MRC considers appropriate to anyone affected. Generally, this will be by means of a public notice published in newspapers circulating in the region affected by the declaration. The notice will specify the region to which the water restrictions apply, the level of restrictions, including an outline of permitted hours and use of water, the period of operation of the declaration, penalties for contravention and contacts for further information. This information will be made available on the MRC website.

Additional media release of information and individual customer notification pertaining to water restrictions may be made as appropriate.

Unless otherwise substituted or revoked by a subsequent declaration or published notice, water restrictions cease to have effect at the end of any period specified in the notice.

6.6 Compliance

During a period in which water restrictions are in effect, water from the water supply system shall not be used except in accordance with that set out in Schedule 1 for the declared level or as contained in any approved exemption.

6.7 Offences

Within a period in which water restrictions are in effect, a person allegedly contravening a water restriction will be investigated.

Where an Authorised Officer determines an offence has occurred, the Authorised Officer may issue a Penalty Infringement Notice.

Where an Authorised Officer determines any subsequent offence has occurred, MRC may issue a Penalty Infringement Notice and/or restrict domestic water supply and/or instigate legal action.

Where a Penalty Infringement Notice is issued and the alleged offender feels aggrieved by the Notice, an Application for Waiving of the Penalty Notice must be lodged in writing to the Chief Executive Officer stating the grounds and all related circumstances of the appeal within 28 days of the issue date of the Penalty Infringement Notice.

The Chief Executive Officer or other delegated officer will consider the appeal based on its merit to determine whether an appeal will be upheld or dismissed.

6.8 Exemptions

Where an exemption or amendment to water restrictions is sought, applicants shall apply for each individual property or circumstance.

Applications shall be forwarded to the Chief Executive Officer.

Applications may be:

- approved unconditionally; or
- approved subject to certain conditions; or
- not approved.

Applications will only be considered where reasonable grounds for such exemption have been presented and the prescribed fee has been paid. Application fees are non-refundable.

Exemptions for watering new turf will only be issued for 10 days. Applications should be submitted at least one (1) week prior to the laying of new turf.

Approval, if granted, will be in writing and takes effect as of the date of such approval.

Approvals may be modified or withdrawn at any time MRC sees fit. Extensions to exemptions may only be issued in special circumstances and upon review. If an extension is required under normal circumstances an additional application must be submitted.

Any such approval is final and binding upon acceptance by the applicant.

The Water Restrictions Application for Exemption of Amendment Form provides an application for an exemption to water restrictions.

Approved applications will be issued with an Exemption Permit with the approval. The exemption permit is to be displayed in a prominent position on the approved property and is to be removed on the expiry of the permit and returned to MRC.

Displaying an expired exemption permit or an exemption permit on any property other than the approved property will be considered to be an offence

7.0 Review of Policy

This policy will be reviewed when any of the following occur:

1. The related documents are amended or replaced.
2. Other circumstances as determined from time to time by a resolution of Council

Notwithstanding the above, this policy is to be reviewed at intervals of no more than three (3) years.

 - Botanic Gardens (exempt areas to be identified in consultation with Water Services)
 - Jubilee Park (grass monuments only)
 - Queen's Park (grass around monuments only)
 - Mulherin Park
 - Field of Dreams
 - Nebo Road median between Lagoon Street and Bridge Road
 - Tourist Bureau
 - Civic Precinct Lawns
 - Mt Bassett, Mackay, Walkerston, Marian, Mirani and Sarina Cemeteries, garden beds and some grassed areas
- Water trucks can water street trees only once every 6 weeks

- The following areas can be watered one day a week, for a maximum of an hour on that day, with a hand-held trigger or twist nozzle, outside the hours of 10am and 4pm

APPLICATION CONSIDERATION & CONDITIONS

An Application Fee is to accompany each application for exemption. The fee is set out in the Mackay Regional Council Fees and Charges Schedule.

Exemptions will be assessed based on the provisions of Mackay Regional Council's Policy No. 040 – Water Supply Conservation, taking into consideration: -

- Prevailing weather conditions
- Water allocation available to Mackay Regional Council
- Water demand and progressive annual consumption
- The realistic needs of the customer applying for the exemption
- Any special requirements of the customer applying for the exemption
- Supporting evidence tendered in justification of the application
- That the exemption is in the public interest

Mackay Regional Council reserves the right to withdraw or further modify any approved exemption at any time.

An application will not be considered unless the applicant is able to demonstrate and satisfy at least one of the below criteria: -

1. The exemption is essential to avoid an undue adverse impact upon the livelihood of the customer should the designated level of water conservation be imposed and no reasonable alternative is available.
2. Exemption is necessary due to the special needs of the customer provided:
 - The proposal merely alters the hours permitted under the declared level of water conservation
 - The proposal merely alters the days permitted under the declared level of water conservation
 - The proposal would not increase the number of hours or days permitted under the declared level of water conservation
3. The exemption would avoid or minimise permanent physical damage to a building or structure owned by the customer.
4. The exemption is necessary to avoid any adverse effect on public health, wellbeing or safety.
5. The exemption is necessary to avoid serious health or safety consequences for an individual applicant.
6. The exemption is essential to avoid or minimise adverse effects resulting in permanent or irreversible damage to a public or private asset of historical, botanic or ecological significance.

The applicant must demonstrate and provide evidence that possible alternatives have been explored and no reasonable alternative is available, to the satisfaction of Mackay Regional Council.

An exemption, if approved, is not transferable to any other person or entity or location.

An exemption, if approved, is applicable only to the level of water conservation under which the approval was granted. Upon declaration of a revised level of water conservation, exemptions may be withdrawn, modified, or subject to additional conditions being imposed.
