After cutting these sheaths and gluing them to a baseboard, an image can be scratched in the shiny surface, enabling ink to penetrate and hold in the fibrous tissues of the organic plate when it is inked. Juliana and a work colleague, Betsy Atkinson, Mackay Christian College drama teacher, discussed the situation in October 2007. This lead to the establishment of the 'Whitsunday Arts Projects'.

'Whitsunday Arts Projects' is a unique and exciting venture that will continually create opportunities and experiences in the dramatic field for the youth of Mackay. Both Juliana and Betsy strongly believe in providing bigger and better learning experiences for their students and with the help of Backbone Youth Arts, a prominent youth theatre company in Brisbane, these opportunities are about to occur.

On the 31st of March two well-known artists will be arriving in Mackay for three days to run student and teacher workshops. Joe Mitchell is currently the Youth and Education Manager of the Queensland Theatre Company and a prominent figure in the theatre scene in Brisbane. He will be joined by Andrew Cory, an experienced actor and teacher of theatre styles such as clowning and physical theatre. He is also the Artistic Development Coordinator for Backbone Youth Arts.

Andrew stated that "Backbone Youth Arts is quickly emerging as Queensland's premier youth theatre company. We are very excited to be able to create partnerships with passionate regional artists and teachers to create exciting arts experiences for children and young people. It may only be small now but this three day festival may be the start of something very big and I hope that this is just the start of our relationship with the young performers of the Mackay region".

These two dynamic and talented artists will, across three days, work with approximately 90 youth across Mackay and along with Juliana Milroy and Betsy Atkinson hope that this leads to more exciting and innovative theatre throughout the state.
