Sarina Landcare Catchment Management Association Inc. (SLCMA)

SLCMA is a community based not-for-profit organisation that formed in 2001. SLCMA operates in the Sarina Catchment Area, which covers approximately 169,000 hectares and consists of sub-coastal mountains, coastal ranges, alluvial and coastal plains.

SLCMA encourages and assists the local community in understanding, managing and retaining it's natural resources and unique biodiversity.

Our objectives are to:

- Prepare and implement priority action plans.

Our membership includes individual land managers, industry, Local & State Government organisations, local community groups and junior Landcarers.

SLCMA Community Resource Centre together with our friendly staff provide the community with up-to-date information on local flora & fauna, pests, land management practices and other natural resource management topics.

Projects and Programs

SLCMA Community Nursery provides a training base for the local community & volunteers in NRM activities such as seed collection, native plant propagation and bush regeneration. Native seedlings are distributed to schools, SLCMA members and for community projects.

Volunteers meet every Wednesday at the SLCMA Community Nursery. The volunteers enjoy a range of activities both in the nursery and in the field including native plant identification, seed collection and plant propagation.

Sarina Coastal Sustainable Landscapes Project is a
