**ARTSPACE Mackay hosted** internationally-acclaimed artist duo Alfredo and Isabel Aquilizan for a week-long artist-in-residence program in late March. During this time, Alfredo and Isabel facilitated community art workshops at Artspace Mackay, George Street Neighbourhood Centre, Dudley Denny City Library, Mackay West State School, Mackay Central State School and St Patrick's Secondary College as part of their new project Take Root (Colony): Project Another Country. Over 300 Mackay children and adults participated in these free workshops, which saw them making unique cardboard homes that will be added to a huge art installation at Artspace Mackay, which opens on June 14.

# What's on at George Street Neighbourhood Centre?



The George Street Neighbourhood Centre Association Inc Multicultural Community Program provides information, referral and support to individuals and families who have culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds.

### **DV Survey**

George Street Neighbourhood Centre, with support from Australia's National Research Organisation for Women's Safety (ANROWS), are working on a survey to gain an understanding of how some members of culturally and linguistically diverse communities in the Mackay region define domestic and family violence at this point in time. They will also gather together some of their ideas about how domestic and family violence services can better support women in CALD communities. The survey rolled out in January 2019 and targeted CALD individuals living in the Mackay region. Further updates and research results will be shared in following Migrant Voice editions, as well as will be available through George Street Neighbourhood Centre. ### CAMS Multicultural Community Program (MCP)
