row, next week's Mackay Anzac Day main parade march will form in the car park behind Dudley Denny City Library on the corner of River and Gregory streets.

Council will also this year offer a free shuttle bus to the assembly point for veterans and students participating in the march.

Students and veterans are being encouraged to park their vehicles at Caneland Central and walk down to the assembly point.

Or, a limited amount of free shuttle buses will be available to transport veterans and students to the meeting point.

Mayor Greg Williamson said the free bus service would not be possible without the generosity of volunteers.

generously donated their own time to drive the buses on Anzac Day," he said.
