

Coastal Banksia

Banksia integrifolia

BANKS-ee-uh in-teg-rih-FOH-lee-uh

Category: Tree (5-10m)

Height: 6 metres

Spread: 4 metres



A slow-growing woody tree with dark green leathery leaves that have silvery undersides and woody upright cones.

Banksias produce yellow-golden cylindrical flowers with the main flowering happening in autumn to early winter.

Can be used as an ornamental shrub with older specimens becoming attractively gnarled. Common in local coastal dune systems.



Full sun - part shade



Drought tolerant once established



Well-drained soils



Insect and butterfly attracting



HOT TIP: The Coastal Banksia suits many different areas from coastal gardens where it will handle salt-laden winds with ease, to cooler inland areas where it is frost and drought tolerant.
