

Coastal Banksia

Banksia integrifolia

BANKS-ee-uh in-teg-rih-FOH-lee-uh



A slow growing woody tree with dark green leathery leaves with silvery undersides and woody upright cones.

Banksias produce yellow-golden cylindrical flowers with the main flowering in autumn to early winter.

Can be used as an ornamental shrub with older specimen becoming attractively gnarled. Common in local coastal dune systems.

Height: 4 to 15 metres

Spread: 1 to 6 metres

Drought tolerant
once established



Well drained soil
