Executive Summary

DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

February was again a wet month with a significant amount of rainfall across the Region, impacting on Park maintenance activities. Despite this wet weather, a number of park capital projects were completed, including the installation of two barbecues at Bucasia Esplanade, replacement of aged play equipment at George Moore Park and opening of the Apex Park Dog Park in Sarina.

Development application numbers have remained below projections, however there has been strong development activity with new stages of previously approved subdivisions constructed and new lots released.

A technical report to support a business case for the Sarina Town Centre Revitalisation Study is progressing well, along with a number of other strategic planning projects including the preparation of the masterplan for the Mackay Waterfront Priority Development Area. The Bakers Creek South Mackay Stormwater Trunk Infrastructure Study has been completed for Council consideration and a draft Floodplain Management Plan prepared for Mackay.

The Mackay City Fifth Lane project has progressed with the completion of a Rainbow Lorikeet and Ulysses Butterfly artwork in the Lane. Issues associated with maintenance and waste management in the Lane are being addressed, with their successful resolution critical to the project's success.

The Mountain Bike Strategy has been finalised and adopted by Council. To progress the opportunities identified in the Strategy for mountain biking in the Mackay Region, a feasibility/business case to investigate the Eungella-Finch Hatton Mountain Bike Park has been commenced.

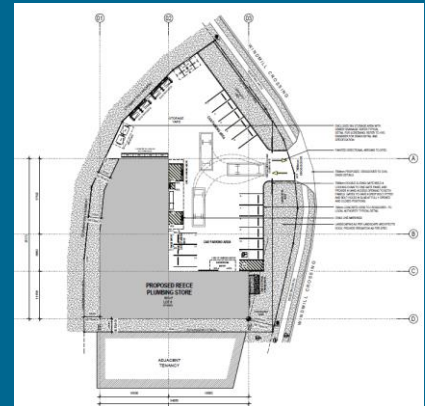

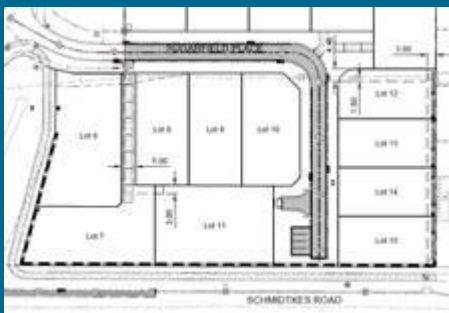
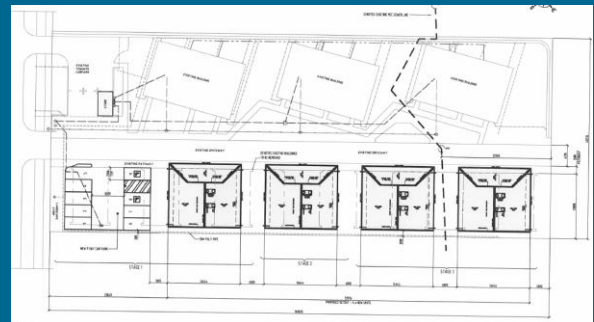

Monthly Safety Review

Summary

Four injuries to a MRC employee were reported in February:

- A worker cut their thumb with a utility knife when dismantling a temporary safety fence.
- A worker injured their ankle after slipping while whipper snipping.
- A worker experienced back pain after operating a mower.
- A worker was bitten by a spider while picking up a fallen palm frond.

Eight incidents involving asset damage were reported in February:

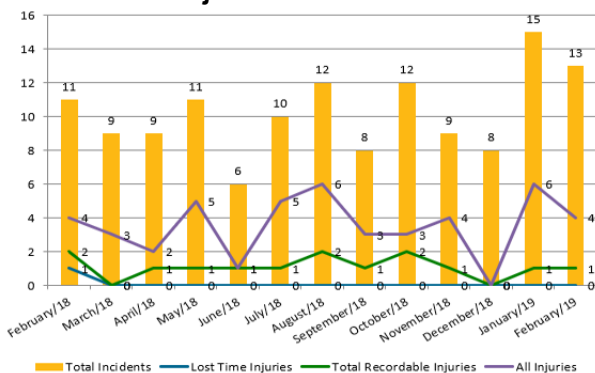
- While whipper snipping, a stone flicked up, smashing the window of a MRC truck.
- While driving along an entrance track, a tree branch got caught on the roof rack of the vehicle, striking driver's side door.
- A vehicle being moved struck a drinking water fountain, causing damage.
- While reversing a tractor slasher along a fence line, the front wheel hit a fence, causing minor damage.
- While mowing in long grass, the mower ran over traffic counter tubing, which became tangled in the mower blades.
- A rock flicked up from a mower hit and damaged a non-staff member's vehicle.
- A lawn mower operator smelt smoke, and upon exiting the mower saw flames under the bonnet. The flames spread quickly and the fire was unable to be extinguished.
- While reversing a truck near an existing pile of logs to dump more, a log hit the tool box on the truck causing damage.

One near miss incident was reported in February.

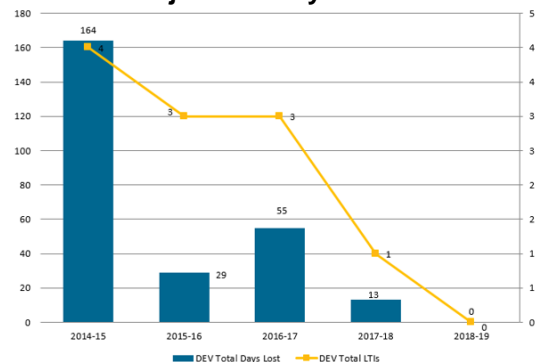
- While filling a five litre container with fuel, some fuel spilt out onto the feet and legs.

Each incident is investigated, and appropriate corrective measures implemented to reduce future risks.

Financial Report

The Development Services budget continues to be impacted by vacancies across some program areas, in particular Strategic Planning and Parks, Environment & Sustainability, with a number of positions under recruitment. New strategic planning projects have commenced and will reduce the budget variance in this program area as they progress.

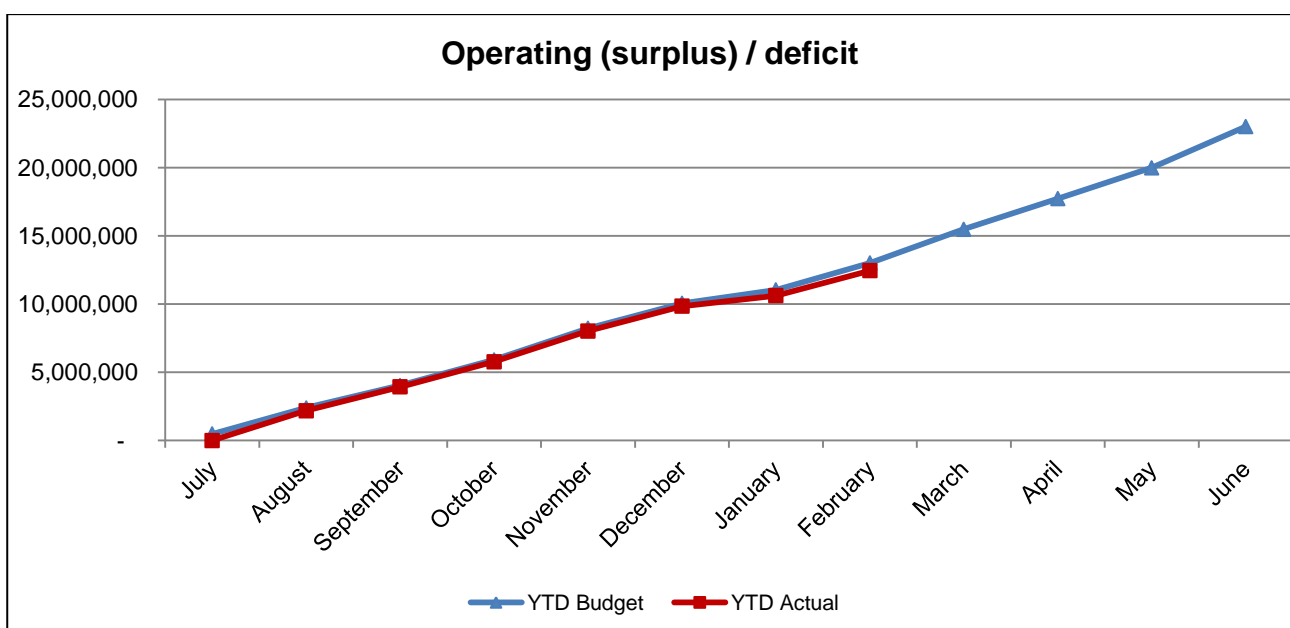
Development application numbers have increased but remain below projections for this time of the financial year, impacting negatively on the Development Assessment program budget. As a result, income projections from application fees is likely to require reconsideration at the March budget review. While new application numbers are lower than projected, there are a number of approved subdivision applications which are being progressed, with undeveloped stages being completed and new lots coming on line. This has led to a continuing increase in development contributions and subdivision clearance fees resulting in a surplus in the Development Engineering budget.

Expenditure in the Economic Development & Tourism program has evened out, now showing a small surplus. Activities in the program are progressing well and within budget, and a number of projects, including the development of the new Economic Development Strategy, is about to commence. The Parks, Environment & Sustainability program was again impacted in February by wet weather. It is expected that operations will return largely to normal levels in March.

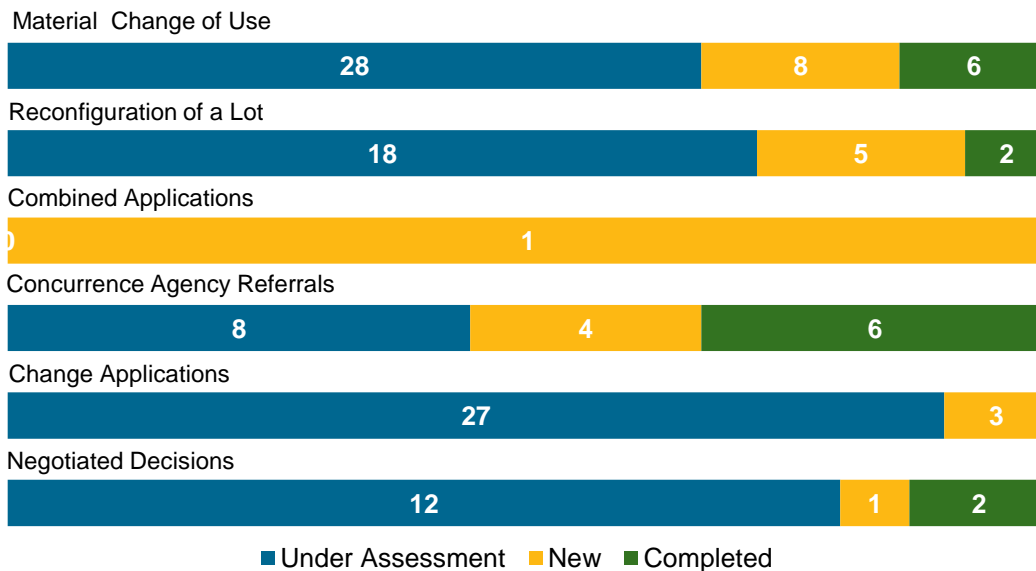

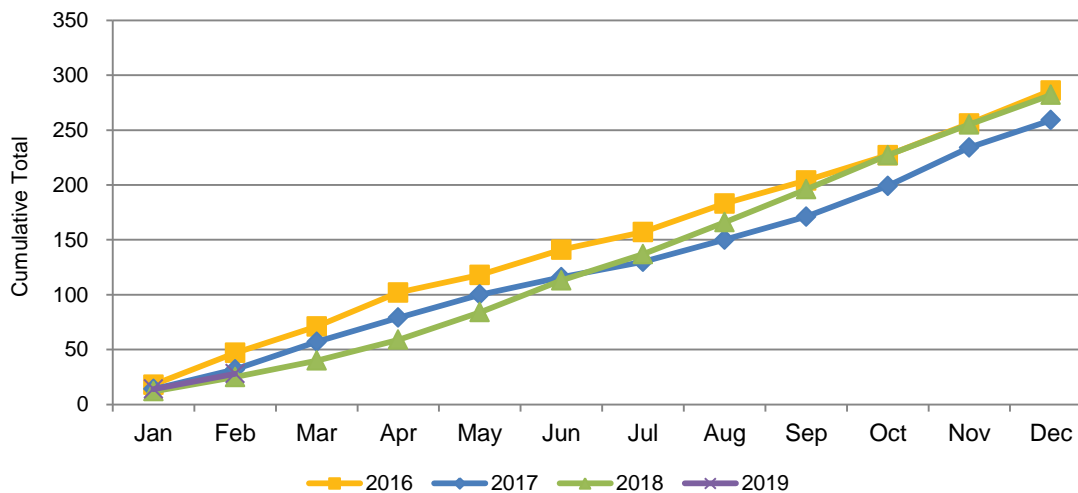

Cumulative Number of Approved Development Assessment Applications

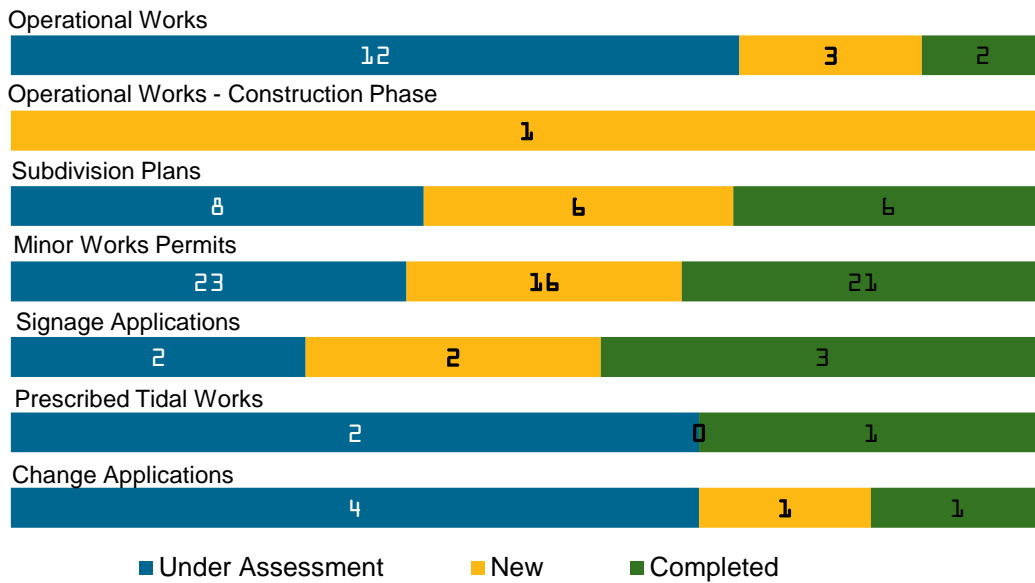

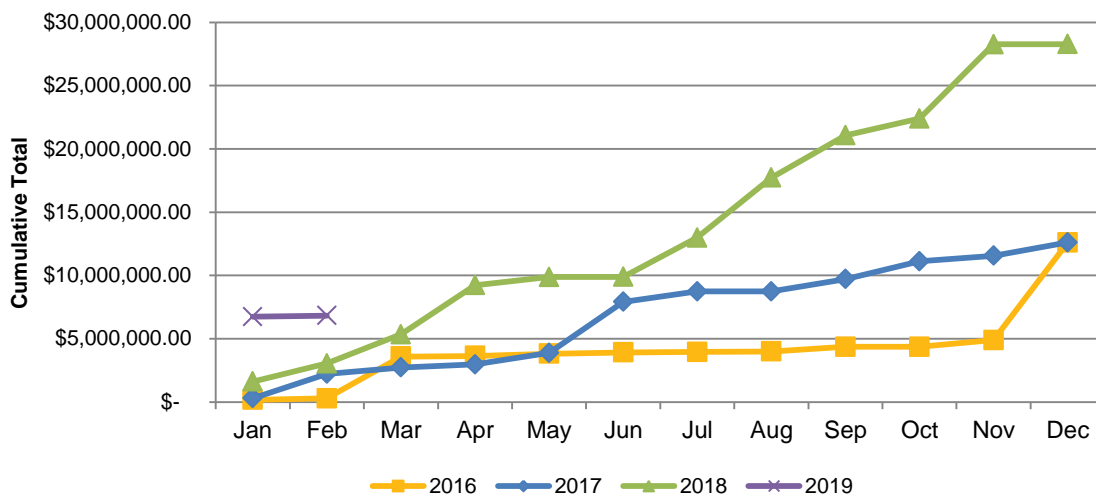
