This vine with highly scented flowers can be grown as a climber or pruned as a shrub so the fruit can be accessed more easily. It makes an excellent screen when trained along a fence or trellis. Does well in most well-drained soils and for optimal fruiting, regular watering during the flowering season is recommended.

The fruit has a sweet tangy flavour and contains four times the amount of the antioxidant lycopene than any other fruit in the world and 10 times more than tomatoes.

HOT TIP: An excellent companion plant, when grown in orchards it can increase yields from the fruit trees by up to 10% due to the nitrogen fix it provides with its root system
