## Executive Summary

### DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

The local economy continues to go from strength to strength and numerous exciting developments are moving through the approval process with several scheduled to commence construction very soon. Many of these major projects have been facilitated by Council such as the Wallman's Road project which will begin construction shortly and is being built by the developer and largely funded by Council under an Infrastructure Agreement.

The middle part of the year with beautiful winter weather is Council's core events period and many events funded by Council's Conference and Events fund are rolling out over this period. We also have some ground breaking new events which will be announced in coming months. Some new initiatives such as our City Art Walks are proving very successful with the first one happening in the first week of July bringing in excess of 50 locals into the city centre for a guided walk and talk explaining our public art. On a final note, in terms of both finance and safety the end of June figures show exceptional results across the directorate which is a credit to the staff of the directorate.

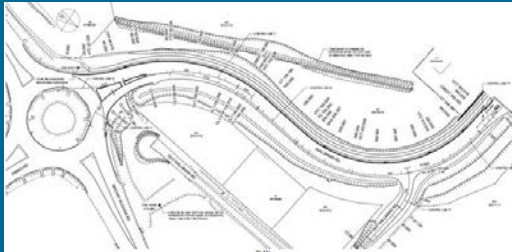

39-41 Wallmans Road, Rural View

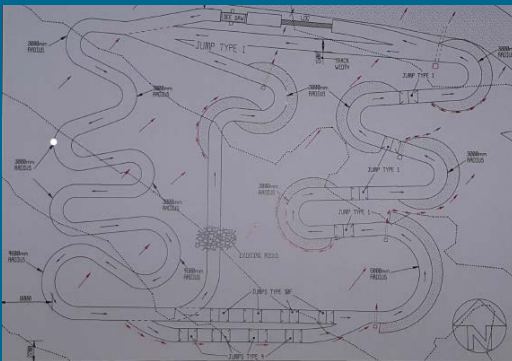

- A worker injured their knee while twisting to pick up an item from the ground.

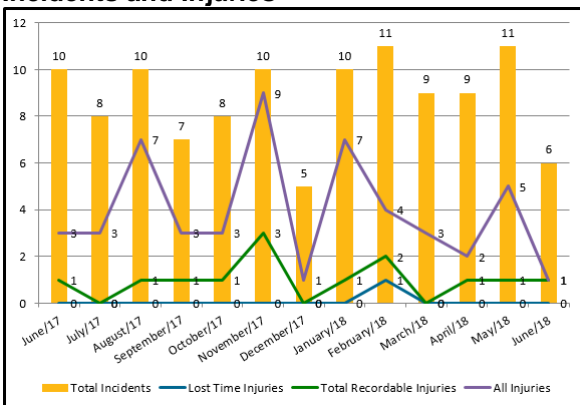
Three incidents involving asset damage were reported in June:

- A passing vehicle threw up a stone, damaging the window of a MRC vehicle.

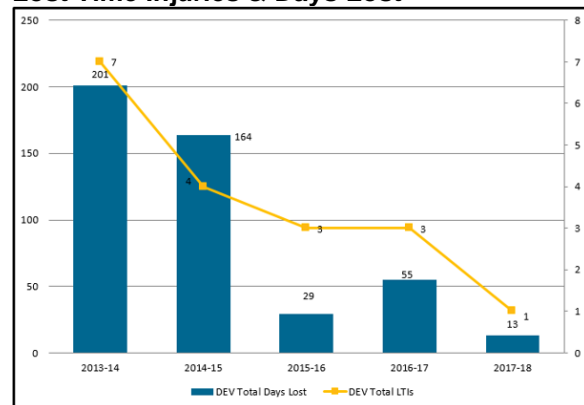
Two incidents involving a contractor or volunteer were reported in June:

### Lost Time Injuries & Days Lost



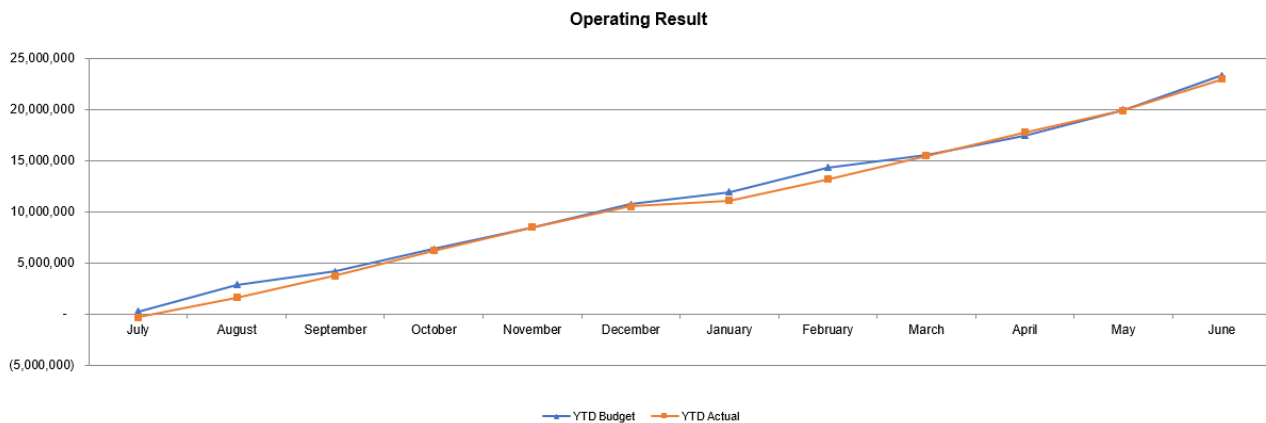

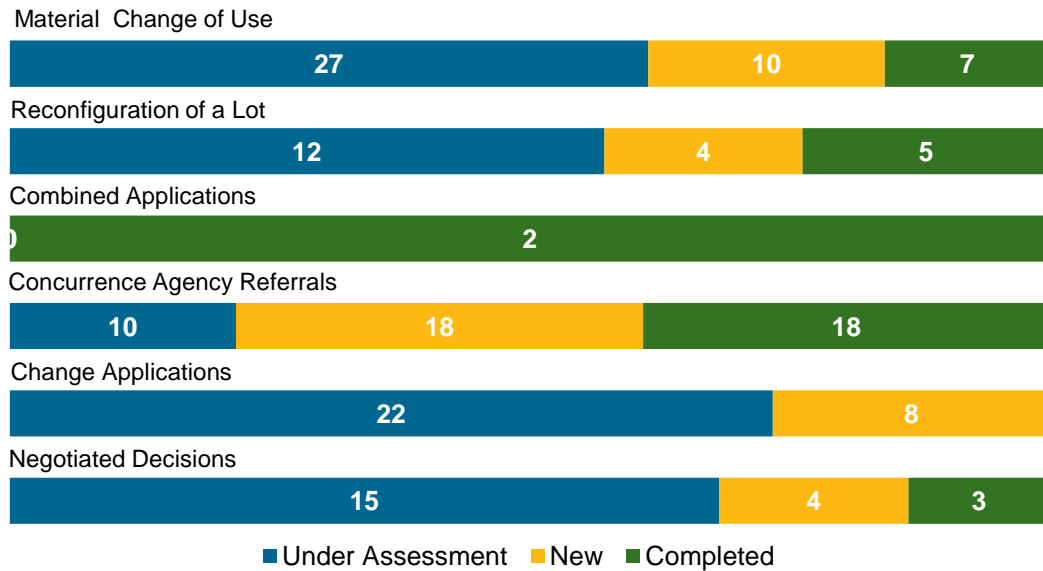

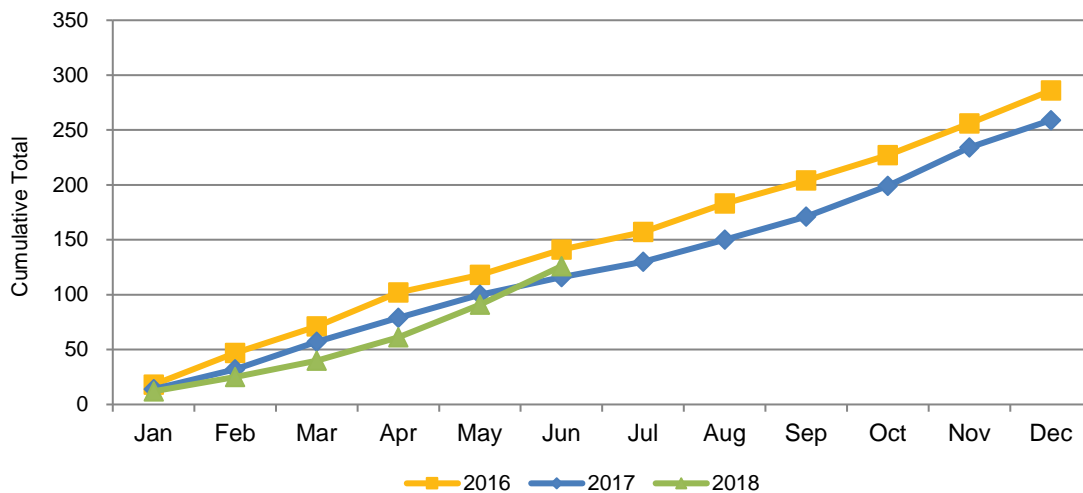

### Cumulative Number of Approved Development Assessment Applications

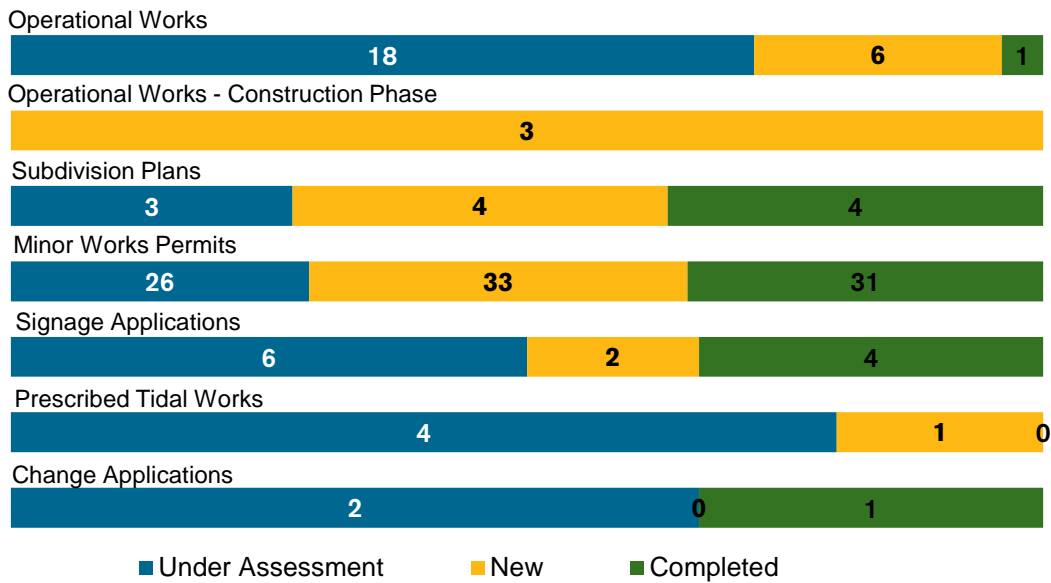

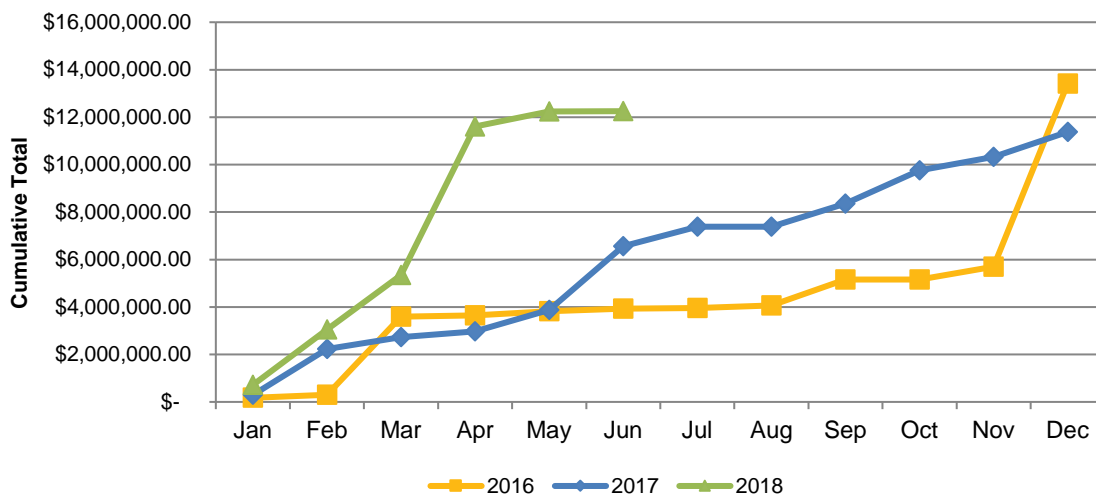

Sarina Town Centre Revitalisation Study	*	The strategy document is complete and will be presented to Council in August / September 2018.
Mackay Region Industrial Land Provision Study	*	Long term study to consider development and infrastructure options for industry investigation precincts in the Mackay Region Planning Scheme. Study will be ongoing to 2018/19.
Planning Scheme Policy – Open Space Policy	*	Council resolved in November 2017 to make a proposed Planning Scheme Policy on Open Space. The policy will set standards for providing recreational parks when undertaking development. Public consultation was undertaken from 16 February to 16 March 2018 and council is considering submissions received.
Mackay Waterfront Priority Development Area	*	The Mackay Waterfront Priority Development Area was declared by the Minister for Economic Development Queensland and became effective by regulation on 25 May 2018. Drafting of the PDA development scheme is well progressed, with formal community engagement anticipated in late 2018. Public consultation at the recent Mackay Show was undertaken to explore possible built form options within the Beachside and Riverside precincts. Infrastructure and network investigations are continuing for various infrastructure types. Concept designs have commenced for some components of the PDA precincts, taking into account the announced Queensland Government QRA funding for Queens Park and the Bluewater Trail.
<p><b>Project Update: Mackay Region Planning Scheme (MRPS) Amendments</b>            Administrative amendment 2 of 2018 was adopted on 27 June 2018 and commenced on 1 July 2018. This amendment made administrative changes to support the inclusion of the LGIP, referenced the Mackay Waterfront PDA and made other miscellaneous administrative corrections and changes. The amendment was included in a consolidated version 2.0 of the Mackay Region Planning Scheme 2017, which included the LGIP amendment.</p>

<p><b>Project Update: Local Government Infrastructure Plan</b>            Council has been progressing the LGIP amendment through the statutory process under the <i>Statutory Guideline 01/16: Making and amending local planning instruments</i> since formally commencing the LGIP in April 2017. At the end of May 2018, council sent a letter to the Planning Minister requesting approval to</p>		

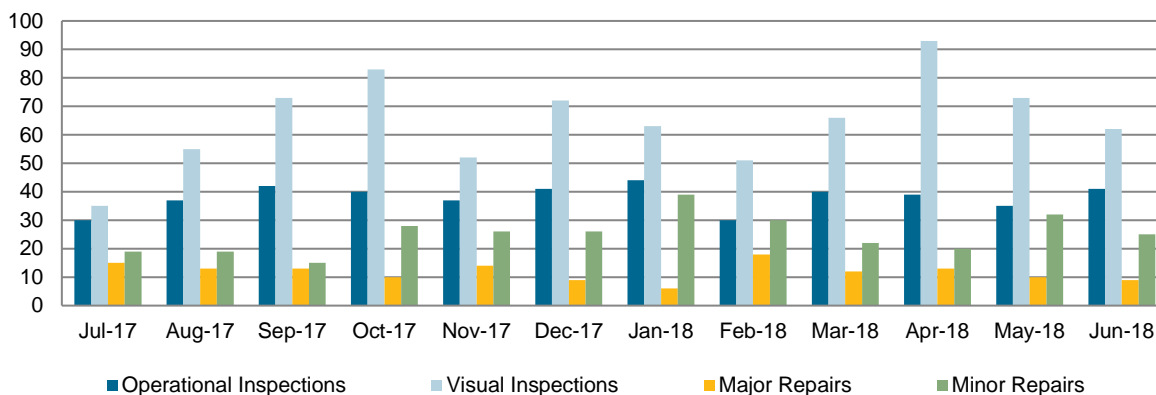


adopt the proposed LGIP and to proceed. Council received a letter from the Planning Minister on 6 June 2018 advising that the proposed LGIP complies with all statutory requirements and Council can proceed to adopt the LGIP. Council resolved to adopt the LGIP on 27 June 2018 through amendments to the Mackay Region Planning Scheme (version 2.0), with a commencement date of 1 July 2018.

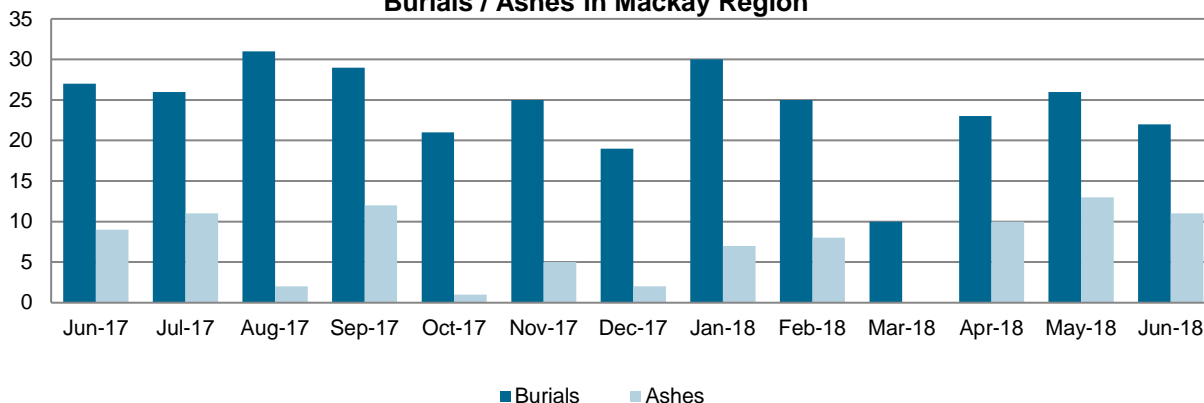

Mackay Region Coastal and Inland Flood Hazard Adaptation Strategy (CIFHAS)	★	The project will identify the Mackay Region's coastal and flood hazards and identify adaptation options to minimize the adverse impacts of these hazards. The current stage is near complete with data now received from the terrestrial LIDAR project (street view image and property details such as floor levels, type etc.). The next stage of the project involves consultation that commenced in May. The strategy is to be renamed the Storm Smart Strategy.
Mackay Floodplain Management Plan	★	Project is in Phase 1 – existing conditions data review. The LiDAR and flood damage assessments are close to completion, enabling the next phases of the project to continue. Phase 2 and 3 of the project, involving mitigation option identification and testing will be undertaken in mid to late 2018.
Bakers Creek South Mackay Stormwater Trunk Infrastructure Study	★	The study has commenced and an existing conditions Tuflow model has been developed for the South Mackay, Ooralea and Paget areas which discharge to Bakers Creek. Problem areas have been confirmed and high-level concepts for testing developed. It is anticipated that the study will be completed in mid-2018.

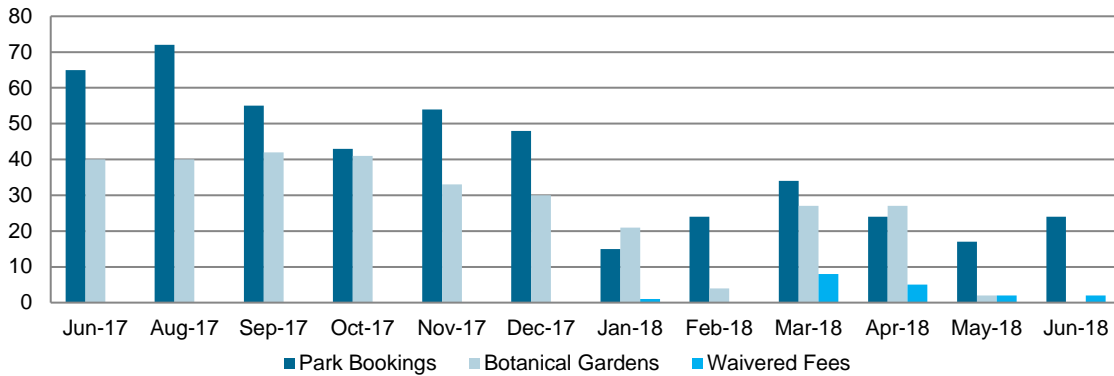

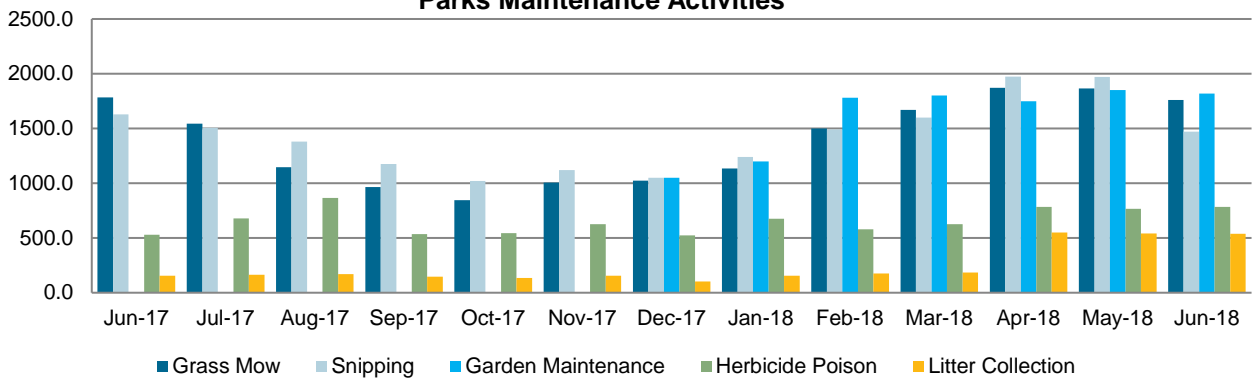

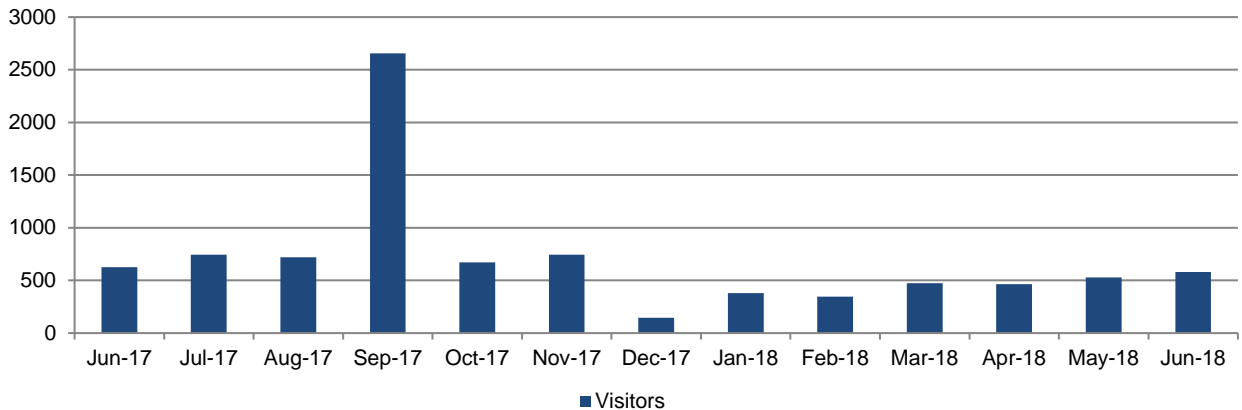

The final two pages of the Professional Services Campaign, was used to place a two-page spread in the Daily Mercury to thank all the companies who contributed articles over the past 12 months. The first of the two events was held on June 6, to launch the Queensland Day Art installation - QLD Day Mackay letters. Local Artists from BASEarts held workshops with local community groups to create images of what being a Queenslander in Mackay means to them. The images were then digitally produced into letters. The letters were then printed on to Eco Ply and then laser cut to create QLD Day Mackay and fixed to individual bases with wheels and solar lamps for illumination.</p> <p>The second and main event, 'Celebrate Queensland Day under the Stars' was held at Bluewater Quay on June 8, when the River Street Twilight Market was held with a host of entertainment, games, competition and street theatre.</p> <p>Although the celebrations for Queensland day had been completed the QLD Day Mackay letters were so well received that they were invited to the Mackay Show on 19-21 June. The Mackay letters were positioned in front of the grandstand and the QLD Day block was used as the colourful backdrop to the Economic Development stand in the council pavilion.</p>
