

# Native Jasmine

*Jasminum didymum*  
JAZ-min-um DID-ee-mum



**A vigorous climber that produces masses of small, strongly perfumed flowers. Probably only suited to large parks and gardens if not pruned or trained.**

It is a favourite feeding spot for insects due to the large number of flowers produced, including various species of native bee. The dense foliage offers good nesting sites for small birds, which are also attracted by the insect smorgasbord, and the fruits, which ripen to black.
