

# Northern Muttonwood

*Myrsine porosa*

Mer-SEEN-e poor-OH-sa



**An open-foliaged shrub or small tree which bears a prolific crop of purple berries on the stems.**

This tree has nicely layered almost horizontal branches with leaves at the tips of numerous side branches. The small creamy white bell-shaped flowers, clustered along the branches, are produced from July to November.

An attractive plant suitable for pots in urban gardens.



Category: Tree (5-10m)

Height: 5-10 metres

Spread: up to 5 metres



Full sun to part shade



Prefers adequate moisture



Prefers a well-drained soil

## HOT TIP:

Potted specimens rarely exceed 1.5 metres high. Light regular pruning encourages bushiness.
