

Sim's Wattle

Acacia simsii

uh-KAY-shuh SIM-zee-eye



A popular small and elegant fast-growing wattle with pretty rounded bright yellow globular flowers along the stem in summer. Useful for garden beds, rockeries, in filling and revegetation.

After flowering this species produces dark brown seed pods which stay on the tree. This small wattle usually grows in sand and gravel in eucalypt open forest, roadside and woodlands. Will tolerate light pruning after flowering.

DID YOU KNOW?

The seeds of this wattle were used as 'bush tucker' by Aboriginal people. Roasted and ground, the seeds produce a powder that has a nutty, coffee-like flavour.
