

Pink Lime Berry

Glycosmis trifoliata

Full sun to part shade

The translucent pink berries of this hardy shrub are sweet, honey-flavoured, juicy and best eaten straight from the bush.

Growing either as a shrub, or as a small tree in the bush, this versatile plant is smaller in a garden situation. Tiny white fragrant flowers are followed by large clusters of berries, around 1cm in diameter, that start to appear in late spring and will bear continuously throughout most of the year. Plants are quite hardy and start to bear fruit at an early stage.

This plant is a host plant for Swallowtail Butterflies.
