Traditional use

The translucent pink berries of this hardy shrub are sweet, honey-flavoured, juicy and best eaten straight from the bush.

Growing larger, or as a small tree, in the bush, this versatile plant is smaller in a garden situation. Tiny white fragrant flowers are followed by large clusters of berries, around 1cm in diameter, that start to appear in late spring and will bear continuously throughout most of the year.

This plant is host to the Swallowtail Butterflies.
