We can help you devise self-guided activities or learning experiences to suit your school, your children, and your interests. We can acquaint you with the wealth of experiences that the Botanic Gardens has to offer. Please feel free to arrange a meeting and/or guided walk with Maya Harrison our Visitor Services Officer.

Let us create learning experiences in your space through our resource program "Planted Elsewhere". We can visit your school to present a variety of topics with hands-on, minds-on experiences and resources:

- Wildlife Wonders: inspect mini-beasts, observe insect features, characteristics and their dependence on each other.
- Simple or Compound?: discover the leaves in your school, identify and sort leaf shapes, names and margins.
- Life cycles of plants, moths, butterflies and other creatures.
- Plant a seed and grow a mind: carry out sorting and matching activities, discover how seeds are dispersed by wind, water and wildlife.

Planning a visit to the Botanic Gardens?

Please notify the Botanic Gardens about *any* planned school or group visit. Whether you wish to be self-guided, or plan to participate in an organised tour at the Gardens, our staff should be made aware of your intended visit. Maintenance such as watering, mowing, whipper-snipping, and spraying could make the area you plan to visit unavailable, events and functions may clash or wildlife may be 'on the move' in certain areas.
