The main objective of the Australian Government's Regional Arts Fund (RAF) is to encourage and support sustainable, community-related cultural development in regional, remote and isolated communities in Australia. While DCITA is responsible for the program, it is delivered on behalf of the Australian Government by the peak regional arts organisations in each state and by arts ministries in the territories.

Regional Arts Australia (<a href="http://www.regionalarts.com.au">http://www.regionalarts.com.au</a>), the peak national organisation for regional arts and cultural development, also receives support through the RAF for biennial conferences, national strategic projects and the accredited training program Creative Volunteering—No Limits.

#### Who can apply?

The development of the RAF recognises the particular needs of artists and communities in regional and remote Australia. Activities eligible for funding under the program are those that significantly involve regional artists or cultural workers. These can cover a broad range of artform projects—including cross-artform and multi-media projects and projects that promote regional planning for arts and cultural development.

Projects that contribute to sustainable cultural development in regional centres and develop partnerships with local government, community groups and others are particularly encouraged.

#### What funds are available?

Funding is devolved to the state and territory regional arts organisations that administer the RAF. Decisions on the administration of the fund are at the discretion of each regional arts organisation, which operate within a general framework established by the Australian Government. Assessment panels set up in each state and territory assess applications and make decisions on funding in their jurisdiction.
