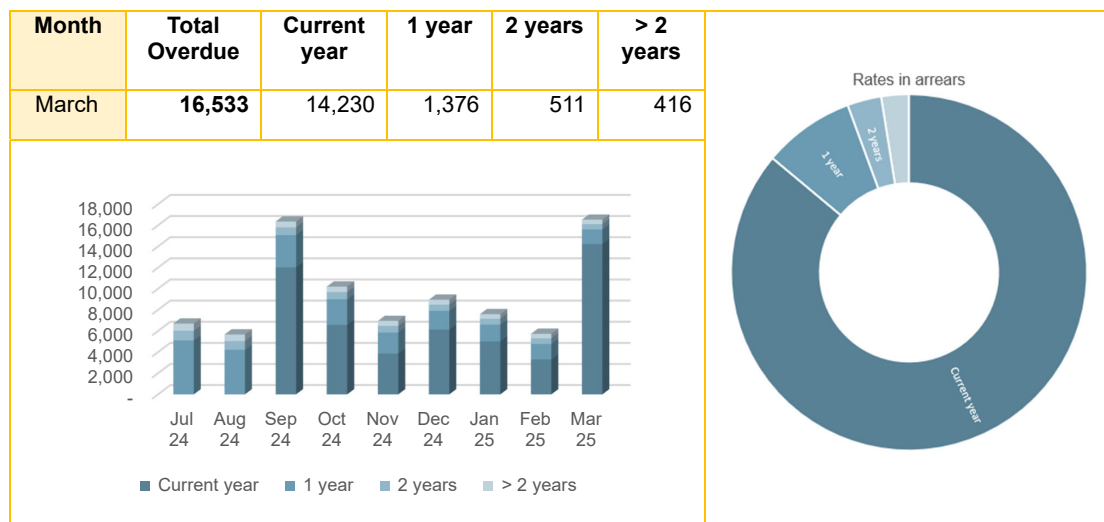

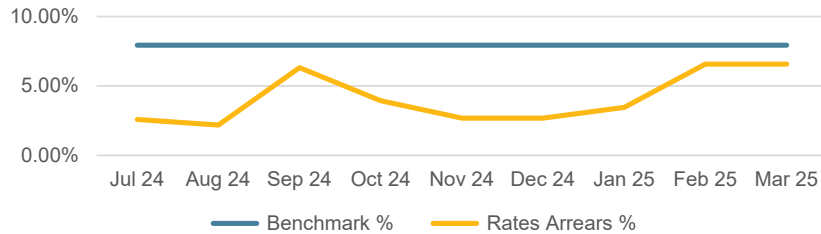

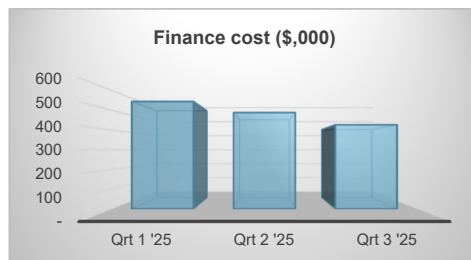

### **Background/Discussion**

In accordance with the *Local Government Act 2009* (the Act), council has charging powers to establish user pay charges. These charges are in relation to the use of Mackay Regional Council (MRC) facilities and for the provision of identified services.

The fees and charges tabled in this report are reflective of both cost recovery items and commercial fees, management have reviewed all charges to ensure they address appropriate cost drivers and industry standards.

### **Consultation and Communication**

The schedule of proposed fees and charges have been reviewed by management and discussed with council's Executive Leadership Team. Fees that have been changed have been further reviewed by the appropriate management representative and executive director.

### **Resource Implications**

Fees and charges form a significant part of council's revenue and provide a source of funding contributed to program service delivery where specific users of a service can be identified, this reduces the impact on general rates.

### **Risk Management Implications**

Fees and charges are developed in accordance with the Act.

##### Our People and Culture

#### **Background/Discussion**

Under clause 6.3 of Council's Standing Orders, any Councillor can request that a matter be included on a Council Ordinary Meeting Agenda.

Cr Christensen has requested that a Notified Motion as below be presented to Council:

- 1. That Council declares the office of Deputy Mayor to be vacant, in line with section 165 of the *Local Government Act 2009*;**
- 2. That Council appoints a new Deputy Mayor from among the councillors at that meeting, as required by section 165(5) of the *Local Government Act 2009*; and**
- 3. That Council commits to conducting an annual review of the Deputy Mayor's appointment, to be considered in April each year, with any proposed changes to the office subject to the required 14-day notice under section 165(4) of the *Local Government Act 2009*.**

Cr Christensen has provided the following information in support of this Notified Motion:

*This motion proposes that Council declares the office of Deputy Mayor vacant, appoints a new Deputy Mayor from among the councillors at the same meeting, and commits to an annual review of the Deputy Mayor's appointment each April.*

*This approach is intended to strengthen transparency, encourage shared leadership, and allow Council to consider—on a regular basis—which councillor is best placed to take on the responsibilities of the Deputy Mayor role.*

*The proposal is not a reflection on the performance of the current Deputy Mayor. Rather, it recognises the importance of giving councillors the opportunity to periodically reassess the appointment in light of the evolving dynamics and working relationships within the elected body.*

*An annual review does not necessarily mean a change in Deputy Mayor each year. It simply provides a structured opportunity for councillors to either re-endorse the existing Deputy or select a new representative if appropriate. This practice promotes fairness, inclusiveness, and accountability within Council.*
